Reader:	The Holy Gospel is written in the 24 th chapter of the gospel according to Luke

Jesus said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." Hear us, O merciful Father, we most humbly beseech thee; and grant that we receiving these thy creatures of bread and wine, according to thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood; who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took Bread; and, when he had given thanks, he brake it; and gave it to his disciples, saying, Take, eat; this is my Body which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me.

Jerusalem Sunday

Since 2013 the Anglican Church of Canada has set the Sunday after the Ascension as Jerusalem Sunday. The Diocese of Jerusalem has thirty parishes across Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Palestine, and Syria. It has established hospitals, clinics, rehabilitation centres and schools in very challenged areas. It provides an international ministry of hospitality to pilgrims through St George's College in Jerusalem, and works with Muslims and Jews to establish peace and reconciliation between Arabs and Palestinians through initiatives like Kids4Peace. This past Thursday the diocese installed Bishop Hosam Naoum as the 15th Anglican Bishop of Jerusalem since the diocese was established in 1841. We pray for the peace of Jerusalem.
