St. John's church sits on the traditional unceded territories of the Attawandaron, Mississauga, and Haudenosaunee First Nations. These lands are covered by the Between the Lakes Treaty and the Haldemand land grant. These lands are also part of The Dish With One Spoon Treaty, all subsequent newcomers have been invited into this treaty in the spirit of peace, friendship and respect. Today this land is home to many diverse Inuit, Metis and First Nations peoples.

Mary Magdalene

This service marks the eve of the Feast of Mary Magdalene, the first eyewitness of the resurrected Christ who was sent by Jesus back to the others to proclaim the news of the resurrection. She is regarded as the apostle to the apostles, even though they didn't believe her testimony. She was from Magdala in Galilee and was healed by Jesus of many ailments which prompted her and a group of women to support Jesus in his ministry. She was one of the few who stood nearby while the Lord was crucified.
