Reading Colossians 3.1-11

So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory. Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. But now you must get rid of all such things - anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

Psalm 49.1-12 (plainchant)

Likewise after supper he took the Cup; and, when he had given thanks, he give it to them, saying, Drink ye all, of this; for this is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins: Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me.

Lambeth Conference

Since 1867 Anglican bishops from around the world have gathered together once almost every ten years to listen, learn, pray together and discern how to best respond to the needs of the world. Last week over 600 bishops, their spouses, and other delegates gathered from 165 countries at Canterbury until August 8, the first gathering of its kind since 2008, representing 85 million Anglicans. The theme of this year's conference is "God's Church for God's World - walking, listening, and witnessing together." This unique gathering has no legislative authority over the different participating dioceses, but will be issue "calls" to the Anglican Communion around nine different themes as a way to affirm what we have in common.

Pray for Bishop Susan and all the bishops present, that this be an enriching time that, regardless of different contexts, expressions and convictions, is, as intended, a vehicle for the unity of the church.
