Reading Isaiah 11.1-11

Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Special Vestry - TODAY

The Wardens have called a Special Vestry to gather today at **1:30pm on Zoom** to authorize them to retain SRM Architects to help us carry the Open Doors priority of <u>our Vision</u> to the next steps. The Zoom link was provided in yesterday's Pastoral Letter.

In June 2021 Vestry affirmed that we are being called to create a new accessible multi-purpose reception hall space that would connect the church to the Parish Centre. Concept drawings were presented to Parish Council in June 2022 and at the Parish Retreat in October 2022.

To move the project from a concept into the next phase, the Wardens will present a motion to retain SRM Architects to develop the design and seek land use approvals. This phase of the project would include preparing drawings, identifying costs, and beginning a process to seek approvals from various regulatory bodies, including but not limited to the Diocese, the municipality, the Bereavement Authority of Ontario, and the Heritage Committee.

This is the first phase in a long process and requires architectural drawings to be prepared. All of this is done in consultation with the diocesan Building Advisory Group, Finance Advisory Group and the Bishop. Once this phase is underway, the Wardens are required to call another Vestry to present the overall design, cost details and funding proposals.

I invite you to attend this meeting to learn more of how this significant part of our vision is unfolding as we continue to discern God's call for us at St. John's. Please send regrets to Thomas Littlewood.
