
From the Wardens

The interest the community showed in our Poppy Project last fall promises to carry on and many are busy once again knitting the colourful flowers for a display in late October and early November.

We are hoping to hold a Parish Retreat Day at the end of October, so stay tuned for details.

In an effort to address Open Doors as one of our four areas of ministry identified in our Vision process last year, the Wardens presented some architect's renderings to Parish Council of what could become a new multi-purpose accessible community reception hall for St. John's situated between the Parish Centre and the church. We are at very early stages of this project, so more details to come.

As always the church needs your participation to help keep things running smoothly. Please consider offering your time. The Altar Guild, Greeters, Readers, Knitters and Quilters, the ministry at Portage, and helping manage some of our property projects are all areas for you to consider.

Rector's Words

It has been a busy spring and early summer season at St. John's, and after pandemic lockdowns I feel like I am slowly recovering my muscle memory for the liturgical rhythm of a week in the parish. It is curious how in the pandemic everything has changed and everyone has changed, perhaps to degrees that we are still learning about. I am still learning what those behavioural changes are for myself. Someone said to me recently, "I need to get back in the habit of coming to church." My inner voice couldn't help but became audible and with a smile I responded, "Yes, you do!"

I continue to be amazed at the depth of your commitment and dedication to make things run smoothly at St. John's. You are a remarkable group of people of immense generosity.

It has also been a pleasure to welcome so many people to St. John's: the Jubilee Evensong in early June, the liturgies with The Elora Singers in July, over 100 visitors who have had guided tours by our hosts on weekend afternoons in late June and throughout July, and the Community Meal program on Tuesdays twice a month. It is just such a treat to actually be with people. That's what Anglicans do - meet together.

As we look towards the fall, I want to invite you to attend something every week as you are able; and

consider inviting someone to join you. But particularly make a point of attending the Evensong September 25 at 4pm to thank Rev'd Judy Steers for serving in the role of Assistant Curate since October 2019. A week after Judy was ordained a priest in March 2020 we entered a pandemic with a lockdown. So the majority of Judy's ministry with us has been during these complex times. Judy has helped to move mountains by creating livestreams, offering Christmas Carol readings on Zoom, organizing the delivery of Lent or Easter care packages on porches across the parish, helping with the Poppy Project, our response to TRC, and assisting in the liturgical and pastoral leadership of the parish. Judy has been a faithful, creative and helpful team player and wonderful colleague who has served us immeasurably well. I trust that you can come to the Choral Evensong on September 25 at 4pm to express your gratitude.

I am delighted that Thomas Littlewood has accepted the Wardens' invitation to work in a temporary part time administrative capacity starting in August. This will be an immense help for me and the Wardens to work in three areas of administrative support.

There is much to be grateful for, and I trust that you can continue to offer your prayers for one another, our community and the world - with intentional regularity, and even show up to be with others in doing so.

Florence Nightingale Award

Congratulations to Jane Rapp who was honoured with the Florence Nightingale Community Service Award on Sunday July 10. The award is a joint presentation from the Elora Festival and St. John's to recognize someone for their history of community service and their role with both organizations. Jane has served as Volunteer Coordinator for The Elora Festival for seven years, and has been involved at St. John's as a chalice bearer, greeter, meal preparer for the women's monthly dinners, and pandemic reopening team member. In Jane's career as a nurse she helped open the second palliative care ward in Canada, was a team lead at the neurological unit at University Hospital in London, a nurse at a family practise in Fergus, and a trusted confidant for parishioners encountering health challenges. Thank you, Jane, for being our "Lady with the Lamp".

It was announced on July 31st in a letter from the Bishops' office that our Assistant Curate, Rev'd Judy Steers, will be taking up a full time role as Chaplain at

St John's Kilmarnock School starting September 1st. In this capacity Judy has resigned her appointment as Assistant Curate at St. John's effective August 31st and the bishop has appointed her an Honorary Assistant at St. John's Elora beginning September 1st.

Judy has been our Assistant Curate part-time since October 2019, and the SJK chaplain part-time since September 2021. While we will miss seeing her week to week, and having her as part of the leadership team at St John's on a regular basis, we look forward to continuing to deepen our historical connections between the school and the St. John's community in the future.



A celebration of Judy's three years with us will take place at a Choral Evensong on **Sunday, September 25th at**
